- Ensure that at least 50% of students who maintained a B rating for English in 2021 will obtain an A rating by the end of 2022
- Ensure that 100% of students who improved in English ratings in 2021 will maintain the improved rating in 2022

Our initiatives include

- Monitoring and reviewing student performance in Literacy to both provide feedback and track improvement, via weekly reports, and term by term analysis (Sharrat and Fullan)
- Identifying students 'at risk' of achieving under National Minimum Standard or below a 'C' in English and developing individual plans that target specific learning needs (Sharrat and Fullan; DoE - Inclusive Education Policy; State School Improvement Strategy Every Child Succeeding 2021-2025)
- Building teacher capability to plan differentiated lessons and embed sound pedagogical practices to improve learning (Hattie and Marzano)
